

How To Create A Subdomain In Your cPanel Account

This article will show you how to create a subdomain through your cPanel. Subdomains are URLs for different sections of your website. They use your main domain name and a prefix. For example, if your domain is yourdomain.co.uk a sub-domain of your domain might be support.yourdomain.co.uk.

To add a subdomain please do the following:

- [STEP 1: Login to your cPanel account at yourdomain.co.uk:2082](#)
- [STEP 2: Select Subdomains](#)
- [STEP 3: Input the subdomain you would like to create.](#)

STEP 1: Login to your cPanel account at *yourdomain.co.uk:2082*

STEP 2: Select **Subdomains**



STEP 3: Input the subdomain you would like to create.

Use the dropdown box to choose the correct domain. Enter the document root path. Select **Create**
